Opinion

Qualified Opinion Arising from the Statement of Investment Property at Cost

We have audited the financial statements of Queen's Club Gardens Limited (the 'company') for the year ended 31st December 2019 which comprise the Income Statement, Balance Sheet and Notes to the Financial Statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Except for the failure to reflect the fair value of the investment property, In our opinion the financial statements:

- have been properly prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

Basis for qualified opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) (ISAs (UK)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. We are independent of the company in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements in the UK, including the FRC's Ethical Standard, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

As explained in note 2, the financial statements do not reflect the fair value of the company's investment property as required by FRS 102 Section 1A. Although that fair value would be in excess of the cost shown in the financial statements, in the absence of a valuation it is not possible to quantify the effect of the omission.
